Arson	Deliberately setting fire to property
Exile	To be sent away from the country you live in and not being allowed to return
Hard labour	Physically demanding jobs as punishment
Justice system	The way a country decides how to punish criminals and make sure the law is followed
Lawyer	A person who will give evidence about matters of the law
Libel	To damage someone's reputation with false information
Mutilation	Body parts being cut off
Vagrant	A homeless person
Wergild	An Anglo Saxon fine paid by the criminal using body parts
